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SUBJ: COAST GUARD CHAPERONE POLICY
A. COMDTINST M6000.1(series), Medical Manual
1. Protecting the dignity and privacy of Coast Guard patients is
paramount. All clinics and sickbays shall follow the chaperone policy
as delineated in Ref A. Clinics and sickbays shall not establish
separate chaperone policies. Patients have the right to request the
presence of a chaperone during examination and treatment, unless, in
the opinion of the Medical Officer, the risk to the chaperone
outweighs the benefit to the patient (e.g., during x-ray exposures).
2. Chaperones shall provide comfort and support to patients during
examination or treatment. All patients shall be informed of the
availability of chaperones. Chaperones shall be of the same gender as
the patient being examined. Any nursing staff member, Independent
Duty Health Services Technician (IDHS), Health Services Technician
(HS) or volunteer may serve as a chaperone as part of their duties.
The Senior Health Services Officer shall ensure that chaperones have
appropriate preparation to include familiarization with the procedure
and basic Health Information Portability and Accountability Act
training to enable them to carry out their duties properly.
3. The Health, Safety and Work-Life Service Center shall ensure the
chaperone policy is adhered to by IDHS and HS assigned to Coast Guard
