



# Captain Greg Rothrock

Captain Rothrock currently serves as the Commanding Officer of the U.S. Coast Guard Research and Development Center in New London, Connecticut, where he leads execution of the Coast Guard's research and development efforts.

He reported to the center following a tour in the Coast Guard's Office of Budget and Programs as the Program Reviewer for the Deputy Commandant for Mission Support, the Assistant Commandant for Engineering and Logistics, and Director of Operational Logistics.

Prior to his assignment in the Office of Budget and Programs, Captain Rothrock served as the Commanding Officer of the Response Boat-Medium Project Resident Office, where he led project management oversight for the delivery of 97 of the service's most capable response boats.



Captain Rothrock's previous assignments include serving as the Cadet Character Development Officer in the Coast Guard Academy Training Branch; Executive Officer of the Legacy Sustainment Support Unit; Human Resource Manager for the Coast Guard Office of Acquisitions; Engineer Officer aboard USCGC SPENCER (WMEC 905); Section Chief and Type Desk Manager on the Patrol Boat Type Desk for Maintenance and Logistics Command Pacific; and Student Engineer, Damage Control Assistant, and Deck Watch Officer aboard USCGC CONFIDENCE (WMEC 619).

Captain Rothrock holds a Master of Science degree in Engineering Management from Northeastern University and a Bachelor of Science degree in Mechanical Engineering from the Coast Guard Academy. He is certified as a DHS Level III Program Manager. Captain Rothrock's military awards include the Meritorious Service Medal and five Coast Guard Commendation Medals. In 2010, the American Society of Naval Engineers recognized Captain Rothrock as the Fleet Engineer of the Year with the Claud A. Jones Award.

Captain Rothrock is a native of Bethlehem, Pennsylvania. His spouse is the former Lori Stroosnyder of New Milford, New Jersey. They have two children, Egan and Elly, and they currently make Deep River, Connecticut, their home.
