Coast Guard Medical Officers who have attended Addiction Orientation for Health Care Provider (AOHCP) training to screen personnel for addiction disorders are now required to complete refresher training and may receive Continuing Education

credit for it. Coast Guard medical, dental, and pharmacy officers are all expected to recognize possible abuse, dependency, and drug-seeking behavior

in their patients. To meet this expectation, it is imperative that all providers maintain proficiency in addiction disorder recognition and intervention, including prescription medication misuse.

- 2. All medical, dental and pharmacy officers shall complete one of the following mandated training category MT-B courses every two vears:
 - a. Do No Harm (Course number 502503 A) or
 - b. The War Back Home (Course number 502503 B).
- 3. These courses are located on the CG Portal under the Training and Education tab (https://cgportal.uscg.mil). Completion of both course vignettes will generate a completed status in CGBI for credentialing purposes.
- 4. Do No Harm is accredited for one hour Continuing Medical Education (CME) $\,$

unit (Category 1) for Physicians and Physician Assistants. One hour Continuing Education (CE) unit for Pharmacists may also be obtained. No CE is available for Dentists.
