- 5600+ billets

 - Response Boats, Aids to Navigation Boats, Cutter Boats, Special Purpose Craft
- 165 STA and 64 ANTS



Contributions to mission

- FY23
 - 64% of lives saved
 - 96% of property saved
 - 82% of LE activities
 - 68% of ATON work

• All with less than 20% of the CG workforce and less than 20% of the CG budget



Fleet management

- Average service life
 - 10-15 years for smaller boats
 - 20-25 years for larger boats
- Various acquisition & sustainment strategies
 - Service Life Extension Programs, recapitalization
 - 8A, small business set aside, partnering with Navy PMS-300, partnering with other DHS Components.
 - Average annual spending on boat recap/SLEP= \$80 million
