Coast Guard Cutter Eagle, the Coast Guard's training ship, departs the Coast Guard Yard in Curtis Bay, Maryland, March 8, 2016, having completed the second phase of a four-year service life extension project. Phase 2 work began in September and included hazardous material determination, berthing overhauls, mainmast inspection, and replacement of the ship's air ports.
