CEU Honolulu Installs New Fuel Tank at Station Maui to Improve Station Resiliency







- ➤ Civil Engineering Unit (CEU) Honolulu completed a replacement of the existing, out of commission gasoline tank at Station Maui with a new 250-gallon tank. The project also provided a new foundation, tank system, associated electrical equipment, and new safety bollards.
- ➤ This project provides critical fueling capability for STA Maui operational assets to include enhanced contingency reserves. Prior to this project, STA Maui had been fueling their 29-foot Response Boats-Small (RB-S) with 5-gallon jerry cans.
- ➤ As evident from the response to Hurricane Dora and the Maui wildfires in 2023, the station requires organic fueling capabilities to sustain operations, including during contingency operations when Station Maui may receive additional RB-S from Honolulu for the response. This requirement is especially critical on remote islands like Maui with limited commercial marine fueling facilities.
