CDR Fawcett currently serves as the Executive Officer of Base Alameda and assists in the delivery of mission support to 19 tenant commands, four Sectors, two Air Stations, four National Security Cutters, and 6000 personnel across District 11.

CDR Fawcett most recently served as the Commanding Officer of Coast Guard Cryptologic Unit Colorado, where she focused her priorities on supporting Coast Guard Intelligence and leveraged partnerships with NSA/CSS Colorado to provide technical signals intelligence support to Coast Guard and Department of Homeland Security. Concurrently, CDR Fawcett also served as the Deputy Chief of Target Tracking and Trends within NSA/CSS Colorado's Operations Directorate, where she led technical signals analysis collection, analysis, and near-real time reporting in support of the Intelligence Community and Department of Defense.

Preceding this assignment, she served within the NSA/CSS Enterprise as the Executive Assistant to the NSA/CSS Cryptologic Representative to U.S. Cyber Command and as an NSA/CSS Director's Fellow. Other past assignments include: Targeting Department Head at Intelligence Coordination Center, Intelligence Officer at Sector San Francisco, Senior Intelligence Watch Officer at Maritime Intelligence Fusion Center Pacific, and Deck Watch Officer onboard the USCGC NORTHLAND.

CDR Fawcett commissioned into the Coast Guard upon graduating from the Coast Guard Academy in 2006, where she majored in Mechanical Engineering. She also possesses a Master of Science in Strategic Intelligence from the National Intelligence Defense College (now National Intelligence University). Her personal decorations include: Defense Meritorious Service Medal (2), Meritorious Service Medal (1), Commendation Medal (2) with Operational Distinguishing Device, and Achievement Medal (1) with Operational Distinguishing Device.
