



Adoption Reimbursement



Information and Procedures

The Adoption Reimbursement Program provides up to \$2,000 in reimbursement for adoption expenses for each child, with a maximum reimbursement of \$5,000 in a calendar year. Benefits are paid after the adoption is final. Reimbursable expenses include agency fees, placement fees, legal fees, and medical expenses.

Eligibility

The following Coast Guard members are eligible for reimbursement/assistance under the Adoption Reimbursement program:

- Coast Guard active duty members and reservists on active duty for at least 180 consecutive days.
- In the case of two married CG members, only one CG member may claim expenses.
- All CG members are eligible for information and referral.

Qualifying Adoptions

Adoptions arranged by a qualifying adoption agency for which expenses may be reimbursed include:

- Adoption of a child under the age of 18.
- Adoption by a single person.
- Infant adoption.
- Inter-country adoption.
- Adoption of a child with special needs.
- Adoptions finalized after 2 November 2007 that involve stepchildren adopted by a military member.

Qualifying Expenses

Reasonable and necessary expenses directly related to the legal adoption of a child under 18, if the adoption is arranged by a qualifying adoption agency or other authorized source. Reasonable and necessary expenses include:

- Public and private agency fees, including adoption fees charged by an agency in a foreign country.
- Placement fees, including fees charged to adoptive parents for counseling.
- Legal fees, including court costs, for services unavailable through the legal assistance office.
- Medical expenses, including hospital expenses of the biological mother of the child to be adopted and of a newborn infant to be adopted.

Qualifying Adoption Agency

1. A State or local government agency, which has responsibility under State and local law for child placement through adoption.
2. A nonprofit, voluntary adoption agency, which is authorized by State or local law to place children for adoption.
3. Any other source authorized by a State to provide adoption placement if the adoption is supervised by a court under State or local law.
4. A foreign government or an agency authorized by a foreign government to place children for adoption, in any case which the adopted child is entitled to automatic citizenship or a certification of citizenship.

Reimbursement Procedures

All Coast Guard active duty and eligible reserve members applying for reimbursement of adoption expenses shall:

1. Complete Reimbursement Registration for Adoption Expenses Form CG-1794, located online at www.uscg.mil/forms/cg.asp.
2. Provide the following supporting documentation:
 - Documentation of the Home Study.
 - Receipts or canceled checks substantiating authorized expenses.
 - A copy of the adoption certificate, court order granting adoption, or proof of the agency's involvement, where a qualified adoption agency arranged the adoption, such as a copy of the placement agreement from the adoption agency or a letter from the adoption agency stating what services it provided.
