



Captain George G. Bonner, P.E.

Deputy Commander USCG Director of Operational Logistics



Captain George Bonner assumed duties as Deputy, U.S. Coast Guard Director of Operational Logistics in May, 2017. The Director of Operational Logistics ensures delivery of mission support logistics to units executing Coast Guard operations and serves as field headquarters for the 15 Coast Guard Base commands. Previous command assignments include Commander, Coast Guard Shore Infrastructure Logistics Center and Commanding Officer of the Coast Guard's Facility Design and Construction Center.

A native of Manteo, North Carolina, Captain Bonner graduated from Manteo High School in 1984 and attended North Carolina State University for one year prior to entering the United States Coast Guard Academy (USCGA). Following graduation from USCGA in 1989, Captain Bonner was assigned to Coast Guard Cutter HARRIET LANE in Portsmouth, VA where he served as Student Engineer and Deck Watch Officer.



His next tour was at Support Center Kodiak, Alaska where he served as a Facilities and Environmental Engineer. From 1995 to 1998, Captain Bonner served as Project Manager at Facilities Design and Construction Center Atlantic in Norfolk, Virginia. Captain Bonner's next tour was in San Juan, Puerto Rico where he served as Engineering Officer for Coast Guard Greater Antilles Section. From 2000 to 2004, Captain Bonner was assigned to Civil Engineering Unit Oakland California as Chief of Planning and Executive Officer. He was next assigned to Coast Guard Atlantic Area as Chief, Infrastructure Planning. From 2007 to 2011, he served as Chief of Logistics and Commanding Officer of Military Personnel at Sector Hampton Roads.

Captain Bonner attended the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign for post graduate studies and earned a Master of Science in Civil Engineering in 1995. In 2007, Captain Bonner completed a Graduate Studies Certificate in Coastal Engineering from Old Dominion University. He is a registered Professional Engineer in the State of North Carolina and Commonwealth of Virginia and a Certified Floodplain Manager.

He currently serves on the Society of American Military Engineers (SAME) Hampton Roads Board of Direction and is a Past President. In 2015, Captain Bonner was selected as a SAME national Fellow. Captain Bonner also currently serves on the Steering Committee for the Hampton Roads Inter-Governmental Pilot effort to adopt a Whole of Government and Community approach to Sea Level Rise challenges. In 2016, Captain Bonner was selected as the American Society of Civil Engineers, Norfolk Branch, Government Engineer of the Year.
